For a truly luxurious stay, try the Omni Amelia Island Plantation Resort. With a private beach, spectacular golf course and several dining choices right on the grounds, this is a great choice for a getaway.

Shop for some wonderful and reasonably priced costume jewelry at the Twisted Sisters shop and have dinner at Sandy Bottoms right on the beach.



#### 3. Navarre Beach

Located on Santa Rosa Island, a barrier island facing the wonderful Gulf of Mexico on one side and a quiet bay on the other, this scenic and unspoiled island is perfect for families. Rent a beach house or a condo like the lovely Summerwind, which has plenty of bedrooms, a full kitchen and a private pool.
